

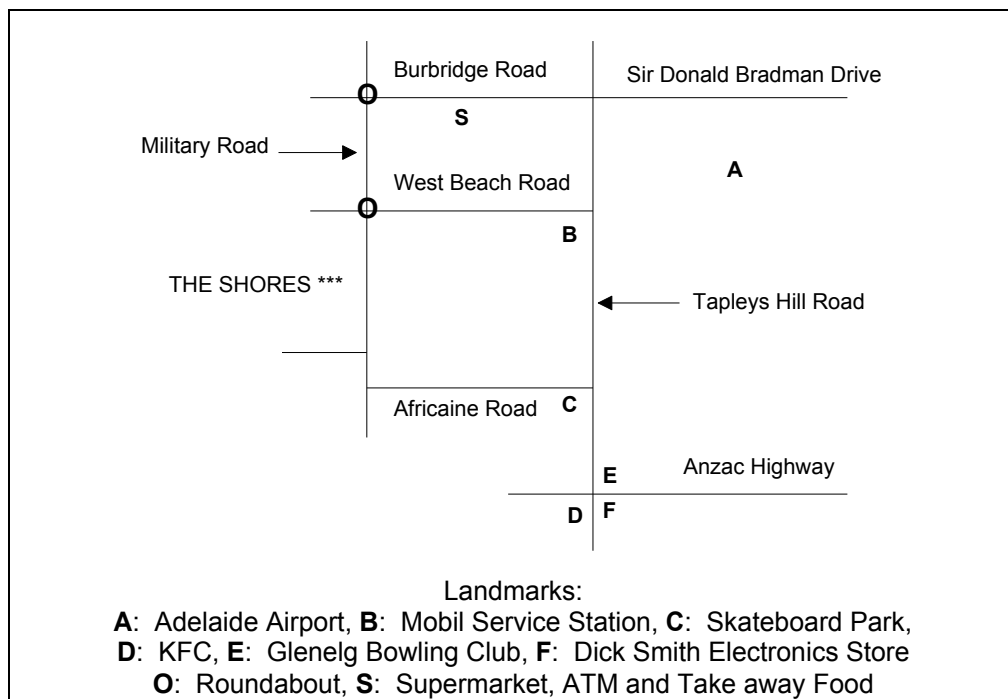


**MG National Meeting 2010**

**REGISTRATION**



Registration will be held at The Shores Function Complex on Good Friday, April 2, from 11.00 am to 4.00 pm. The sketch map drawn above shows the location of The Shores Function Complex. Upon arrival, park your car as directed by the officials and go to the registration area. Remember to bring your club membership card, driver's license and CAMS license (if applicable). Entries for the photographic competition must be submitted at this time. After receiving your registration pack and regalia (if applicable) you will be requested to move your car to the scrutineering area. A café will be open and will serve light lunches. Regalia sales will close at 3.00 pm and re-open from 6.00 pm to 7.00 pm.

We hope that you have a trouble free weekend and you do not need assistance. In the event of an emergency you may find the following phone numbers useful.

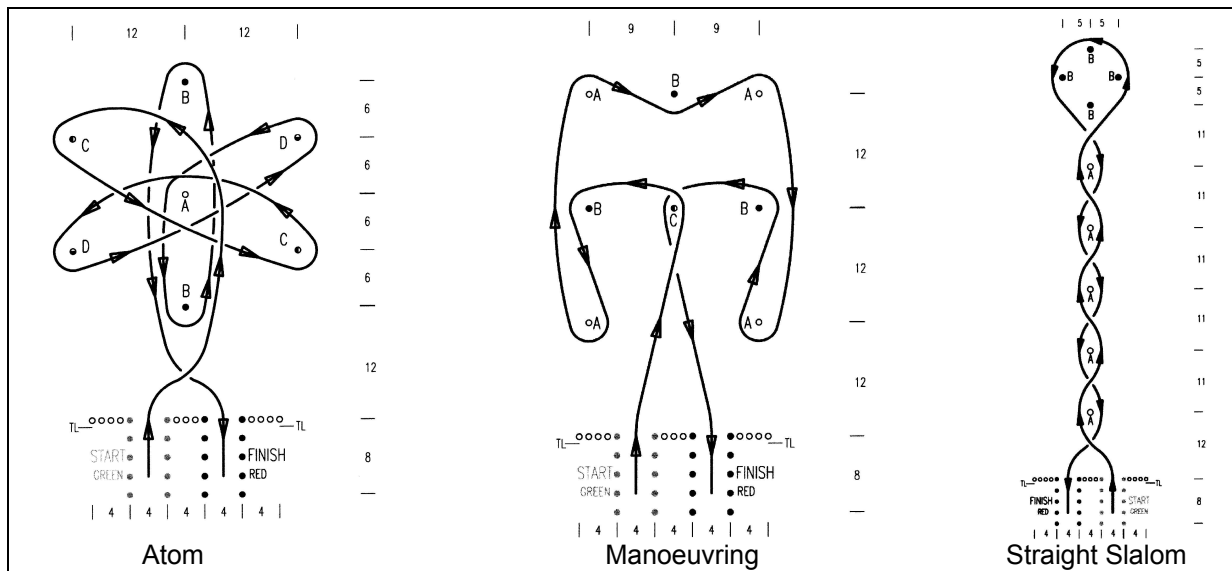

## MOTORKANA

The motorkhana venue is approximately 60 km from Adelaide along the South Eastern Freeway (the main road to Melbourne). The following web address allows you to see a satellite photo of the venue.

The three courses that will be used for the motorkhana are Atom, Manoeuvring and Straight Slalom. Maps of these courses are shown below.



After the motorkhana you may like to follow the old highway back to Adelaide. This will take you through a number of towns including historic Hahndorf. If you wish you can also include a drive to the Mt Lofty summit and then down Greenhill Road as part of your return trip.

## INCLEMENT WEATHER POLICY

The Adelaide City Council will not allow us to hold the Concours at Elder Park if the weather is wet. The alternate venue is the Torrens Parade Ground, a flat space on the opposite side of King William Road. Marshals will direct you to the alternate venue if necessary.

In the event of catastrophic fire conditions in the Adelaide Hills the Observation Run and the Kimber Run will be modified to avoid using potentially dangerous roads.

## MAGAZINE COMPETITION

You are reminded that entries for the magazine competition are to be submitted by the 10<sup>th</sup> of March 2010 to MGCC of SA Inc, PO Box 200, Brompton SA 5006. The judging of this competition will be completed before the start of the National Meeting.

## PLEASE NOTE

As is the case with many parts of Australia, there are water restrictions in Adelaide. This means that you cannot use a hose when you are washing your car. You are permitted to use a bucket of water and a sponge. When washing cars you are expected to stop the waste water from entering the storm water system.

In South Australia there is a ban on the use of single trip bags, previously given out at supermarket check outs. You are expected to take your own bags when you go shopping or carry your shopping without a bag. Supermarkets do sell green bags at the check out. Department and specialist stores are still able to give you heavy duty bags. These are usually covered with the name of the store.

Daylight saving will end on Sunday April 4<sup>th</sup> at 2.00 am. This means you will get an extra hour in bed before your journey to Monarto.
